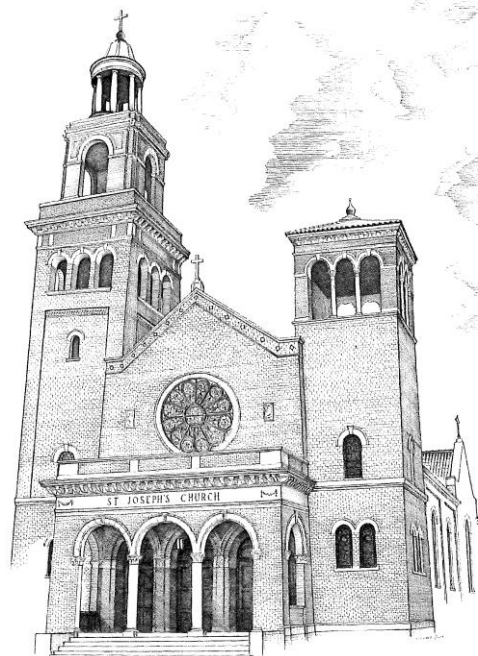

THE SAINT MICHAEL HYMNAL in the pews was initiated one year ago this week. It replaced the *Sacred Songs* paperback music edition of Liturgical Press.

One year ago I introduced the hymnal with, "Any change is accompanied by a time of transition with positives and negatives associated with the change." Our musicians, the school children, and we priests are happy with the hymnal content and selections. Very few parish members have commented on the change other than it is heavier to hold during use.

The cost savings and long term expected use of the Saint Michael Hymnal make it a positive addition to

our liturgy & worship at Saint Joseph Parish. If you visit other parishes, you may notice the hymnal is used in other Diocese of Lincoln parishes. I noticed is the hymnal of choice at the Cathedral in Omaha.
