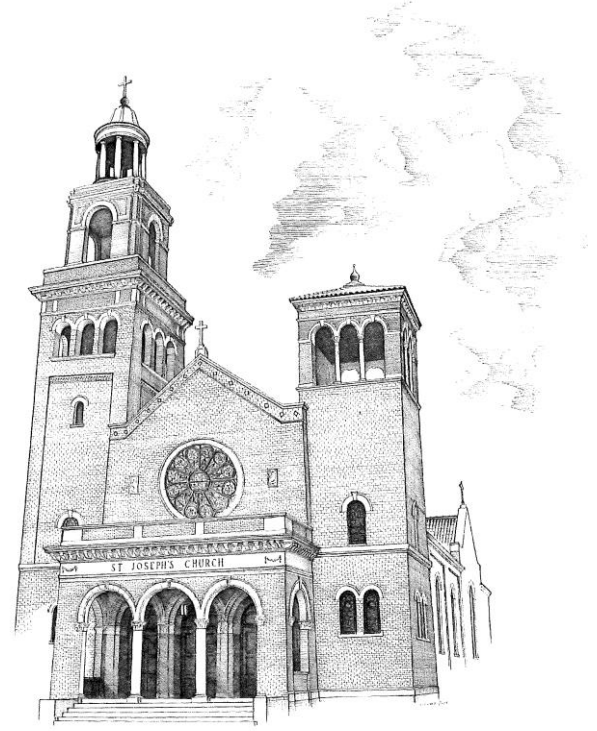

FROM FR. BARNHILL

The following is adapted from "That in All Things God May be Glorified," The Stained Glass Windows of St. Joseph Church, Beatrice, Nebraska, by Rick Nelson, 2004

CHRIST THE KING: The East Rose Window of St. Joseph Church, Beatrice, is dedicated to Christ the King and to the Nature of God. According to local tradition, Father Harte, pastor from 1936 to 1940, developed the theme for this window in recognition of Pope Pius XI's devotion to Christ, King of the World. The stained glass windows in our church were commissioned in 1937.

The center window, below the rose window, depicts Pope Pius seated at his writing table. The inscription "PAX CHRISTI IN REGNO CHRISTI" translates, "*The Peace of Christ in the Kingdom of Christ.*"

Pope Pius XI called for restoring all aspects of public life to God, thus ensuring peace in the world of Christ's Kingdom. In 1925 he established the annual liturgical feast of Christ the King, which we celebrate this weekend.

The actual portrait of a Pope Pius XI in the lower center window has a special significance. To commission the image of a living person (Pope Pius XI was still pope in 1937) required special permission from Bishop Kucera of Lincoln. Tradition does not allow for portrayal of living persons in church art.

Focusing on only the lower arched windows below the actual rose window, the theme is Pope Pius XI's devotion to Christ the King. The left window is a vested bishop, standing before the chair of authority. He raises his hand in blessing. The inscription ET ALIOS OVES HABEO, "*and I have other sheep,*" is the beginning of Gospel of John 10:16 the promise of Christian unity and harmony.

The right arched window has a priest at the altar having completed the words of consecration over the wine and elevated the chalice while the altar server rings the bells. The inscription is the Latin prayer, OFFERIMUS TI DOMINE, "*we offer to you, O Lord.*" The theme is thanksgiving, consecration, and sacrifice which all complete the concept of Christ the King.
