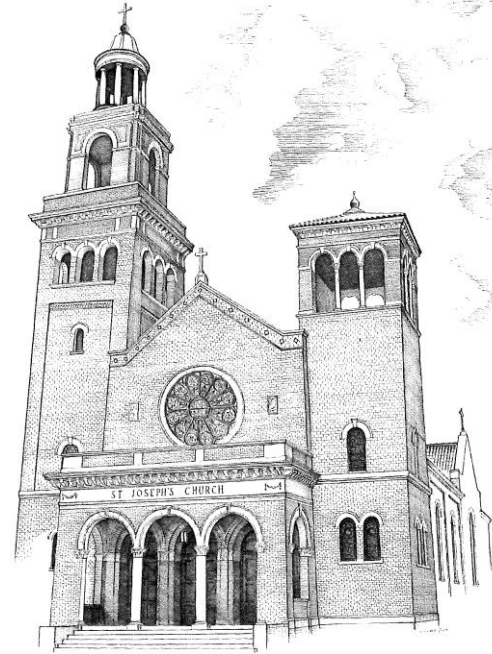

The Spaghetti Dinner (57th annual) is more than a fundraising event for Saint Joseph Parish. Last year (2017) there were 284 tickets sold for Spaghetti Dinner for \$2511 income. Even those who cannot attend have been generous over the years to support this parish Spring event. Our profit last year was \$3500.

Denise Behrends is coordinating the volunteers and logistics of the Spaghetti Dinner. Be sure to thank Denise and her crew of assistants who spend time and effort to make the Spaghetti Dinner a success.
