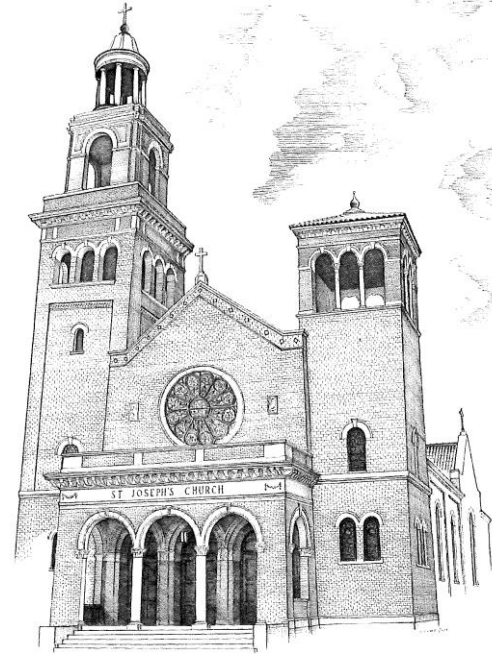

FR MCGUIRE WORDS of THANKS & FAREWELL
On the last day of school I was reminded how much we want good things to last; we ask why they have to end. A kindergartener asked her teacher why one student was not going to be here next year. Because his family was moving. The girl teared up and looked sad; others were sad, too. It was a beautiful expression of how fond the kindergartener had grown of the fourth grader. Like Shakespeare wrote,

“Parting is such sweet sorrow...” That’s what I think of leaving, too, but my emotions are a lot more private and not expressed openly very easily. Right now I feel gratitude to God. In particular, I’m grateful for our school kids’ energy, joy, and desire for what is good. They breathe life into the parish. Our teachers and staff have an inspiring dedication to the kids and families. (Lord, and Sam, protect St. Joseph Catholic School). I am grateful for the faith of so many here. A sign of it is the number who use the Sacrament of Confession at St. Joseph. It shows your desire for God. And from the very first weekend, the liturgies and music impressed me. What great graces all these things are.

I’m thankful for the residents and staff at Mosaic and BSDC. These are *homes* for the intellectually challenged more than institutions. They are family to each other. I’ll miss those I’ve visited at home, in Care Centers and hospitals. Your hope humbles me. I love the small Bible studies, and Light of the World Small Group I joined. We share in each other’s lives and pray for each other. I’m inspired by the St. Vincent de Paul group and how you care for the poor in practical ways. I am grateful for the Altar Society sisterhood, the Knights fraternity, Lenten Exodus 90s, the Over 55 Club and the Companions of St. Joseph support group for chaste men. I thank all who cooked meals for us and all who pray for us, *especially* you “Seven Sisters.” I thank Fr. Barnhill for his example. I knew he was a faithful priest but living with him has let me see he is faithful to prayer and a timely, consistent, creative carrying out of his duties as pastor and head of a Catholic School. He has also given me time and support to work on my health and my personal struggles which I appreciate very much. He is my brother in the Priesthood.

On June 8, I move to St. Andrew Church, Tecumseh. Fr. Craig Clinch is pastor. He has St. Andrew Parish and School, St. Mary Parish in St. Mary, he serves Spanish speaking Catholics, and he ministers to Catholic inmates in the prison. I plan to help at the prison and look forward to it. I’ll be helping with Masses and Sacraments in the parishes, visiting the homebound and sick, and hope to have adult Bible studies and visit a class or two. If there’s a local coffee group to hang out with, I’ll find them too.
