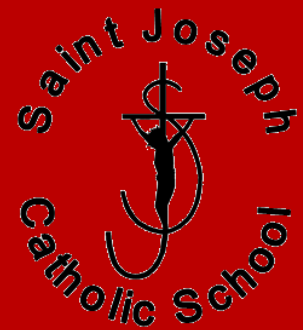




ALL SAINTS DAY ACTIVITIES WILL BE HELD OCTOBER 31ST

All Saints Day is celebrated annually on November 1st. The day is dedicated to the recognition of saints of the Church. Because we do not have school on the November 1st Holy Day, our K-5 students will celebrate All Saints Day on October 31st.

For our new families (and families needing a refresher) I'm going to use today's Raven Review to explain the All Saints Day schedule and activities.

All K-5 students are encouraged to come to school on Tuesday dressed like a saint of their choosing. Most students choose to wear clothing seen above in last year's picture. If you cannot round up clothes to make into a saint costume, you may simply bring a prop to school that resembles the significance of that saint. For instance, if your child chose St. Peter as their saint they could hold a large key. In the Gospel of Matthew 16:19, Jesus says to Peter, "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on Earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on Earth shall be loosed in heaven." The key would resemble the "key to heaven".

After Mass, all our students will gather in the Parish Center for our annual All Saints parade. Students will one-by-one step up to the microphone and tell us what saint they are and a fun fact about them. After the parade is over, we will recite a decade of the Rosary to complete the October month of the Rosary.

Individual classrooms will have class parties throughout the day scheduled between the teacher and room parents. More information will come from your classroom teacher.

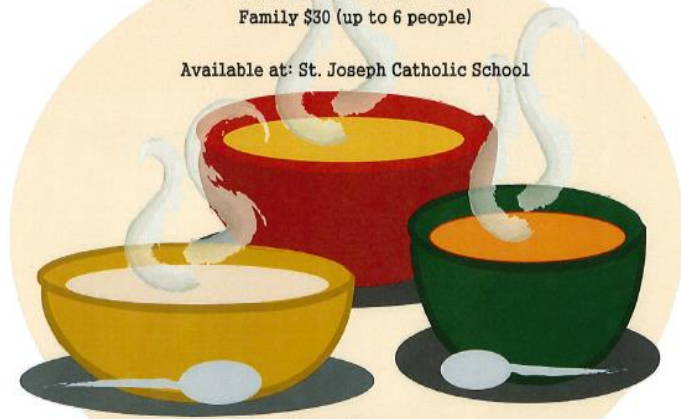

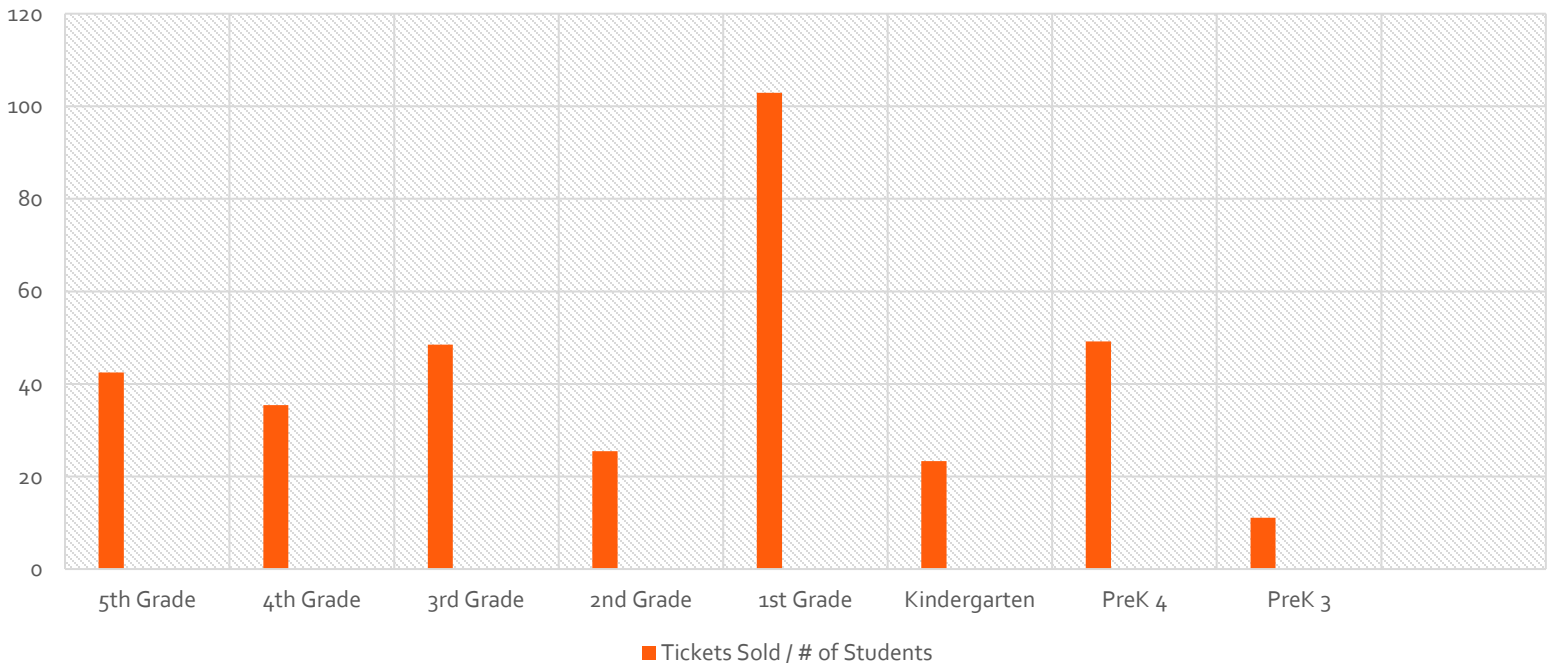
