FROM FATHER BARNHILL

Holy Family Consecration

I have chosen Tuesday, March 19th as the day Saint Joseph Parish, Beatrice will have a common Holy Family Consecration. In preparation for consecration of your family to Jesus, Mary & Joseph, I will offer reflections on suggested practices to strengthen family life; A Family Plan for Spiritual Life. These reflections come from a 2018 document written by Bishop Olmsted of Phoenix. These are the first 3 of 6 practices Bishop Olmsted recommends for the spiritual life of families. The short statements & quotes are also from the bishop's document:

1) Keeping the Lord's Day Holy

Sunday Eucharistic Liturgy is the height of the week.

Make Sunday Mass attendance a non-negotiable when planning the family calendar.

Dress for Mass to reflect the solemnity of the occasion.

Arrive at Mass early to honor the Lord, in Whose house we are guests. Show reverence to Jesus, present in the tabernacle by genuflecting with love & honor.

Participate actively in the Mass by prayerful silence, singing & speaking the responses with conviction & fervor and invite your children to do the same.

2) Monthly Confession

Parents lead the whole family to the sacrament of Penance.

"I can think of few other things you can do for children that would have a more lasting positive effect in their lives, and bring peace to your home."

3) Daily Family Meal (as often as possible)

One social study found this regular meal to be the number one family habit that led to children's success in school.

A family meal as unrushed as possible is where real encounters happen between parents and children, and between siblings.

Families need to disconnect from the world's pace, be present to one another and break bread together.

I will offer 3 more reflections early in the Month of March in preparation for the March 19 Family Consecration. A prayer and brochure will be distributed to you in preparation for the event. The Holy Family Consecration program is sponsored by the Knights of Columbus.
