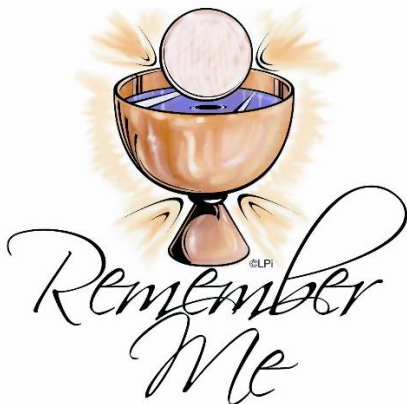

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: Divine Mercy Sunday is now the title of the 2nd Sunday of the Easter Season. It was named by Pope Saint John Paul II at the canonization of St. Maria Faustina on April 30, 2000, and then officially decreed by the Vatican. On this occasion, St. Faustina heard Jesus say, "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. (Diary 699)
