FROM FATHER BARNHILL

DEACON IN BEATRICE THIS SUMMER: Friday, May 24, at 7pm five men will be ordained as deacons for the Diocese of Lincoln. Mr. Brian Wirth of Nebraska City will soon be Deacon Wirth. His summer assignment is at St. Joseph Parish in Beatrice, arriving in mid- June.

The Sacrament of Holy Orders has three “orders”; deacon, priest, bishop. Deacon Wirth will continue his studies one more year in preparation for ordination to the priesthood.

While in Beatrice, the deacon will have his apprenticeship in rectory living and pastoral care. Sacramental care includes assisting at daily Mass, especially reading the gospel and giving a homily on the Scripture readings.

Deacons can assist at funerals, burials, as well as weddings. Taking Holy Communion to the homebound and care homes will be a weekly duty. I look forward to Deacon Brian Wirth spending approximately 7 weeks in Beatrice. I know he would appreciate your prayers this week for him and the other 4 deacons-to-be and the 4 priests-to-be who are on a prayer retreat until Friday afternoon.

TWO PARISH PROPERTY PROJECTS getting attention this week are the 601 Grant Street (Masonic) property soon to be landscaped. Tiemann Construction will begin grading the lot once the retaining wall along Highway 77 is removed. A fiber optic cable has caused a delay in getting the project completed. A special thanks to George Pinkerton who has designed the landscape plan for the corner.

The second project is the two-story white house on the corner formerly a rental house. I accepted a demolition bid from Fosslers to bring the house down between now and end of the month. For now, the property will be graded and left alone until we are prepared to expand the church parking.

Both of these projects are paid for using money from a parish member bequest.
