THE OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE SILVER ROSE PROGRAM is a Pro Life project of the Knights of Columbus to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. Each year a Silver Rose, honoring Our Lady of Guadalupe, is carried from Canada, through the United States, and into Mexico to arrive at the Basilica in Monterrey by December 13, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

This year the Silver Rose entered Nebraska at Scottsbluff on August 21. During its 37 days in Nebraska, it will be in Lincoln September 23-25. The Silver Rose arrives in Beatrice on Thursday, the 26th. All are invited to participate in the devotional Silver Rose ceremony on Friday morning, September 27, following the 8:15am Catholic School Mass. The Silver Rose will continue to Auburn & Falls City, then enter Hiawatha, Kansas on September 30.

The Silver Rose honors Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, and reaffirms our commitment to the sanctity of human life.
