FROM FATHER BARNHILL

REFLECTION PREPARING FOR SOUPFEST:

We dedicate this year's Soupfest activity to the memory of Bernice Clark. She was the kitchen coordinator for many parish fundraisers over the years. Behind the scenes, Bernice was the spearhead of the ordering of food items, the early food preparation and the actual serving of a fundraiser meal. She was often present in the kitchen until the last utensil was washed & put away. I am thankful to those who have taken responsibilities for parish fundraising meals/activities. In my 6 ½ years I worked with Wally Valasek getting ready for Septemberfest, and Denise Behrends in the transition to our current Soupfest. We are thankful for the many others who have taken significant duties in the kitchen, the raffle, the country market, and the silent auction baskets. I read an article in a mission magazine last week, which explained how Christian migrants and refugees of the Middle East have three very intertwined threads of daily life: 1) one's faith, 2) one's family, and 3) the local church. Each fortifies the other.

Migrants and refugees find the church offers comfort and security. The church was "family" to all. The local church becomes an even tighter Christian family when it offers a calming presence, encouraging words, and physical gestures to support the faithful.

Soupfest Weekend offers Saint Joseph Parish, Beatrice, the practical opportunity of living the intertwined threads of faith, family & church. *It is not primarily about the fundraising money!* Soupfest (formerly Septemberfest) builds parish community; a tighter Christian parish family.

- 1) St. Joseph Catholic Parish is a faith community – centered on our Eucharistic table – celebrating Holy Mass in the parish church.
- 2) St Joseph Catholic 393 family units form "one family" offering calming presence, encouraging words and gestures of support.
- 3) Finally, as a local church, St. Joseph Catholic Parish seeks to intertwine faith & family through activities outside of Sunday Mass. Soupfest is about faith & family & local church.
