Is there a healing you desire in your life? Are there wounds that you want Jesus to heal? Fr Craig Doty wants you to answer these questions at a "Jesus, Please Heal Me!" retreat Oct. 30-Nov. 1 at Good Counsel Retreat House. "This retreat intends to provide an atmosphere for you to encounter our Divine Physician in beautiful ways," says Fr. Doty. "His love wants to heal us, and it's only His love that can heal us." "You're invited to come and give Jesus a chance to bring about spiritual, emotion, mental, and physical healing according to your heart's desire." Fr. Doty will help retreatants pray with scripture stories of Jesus' miraculous healings, so they can reflect on what He wants to speak to them about, and talk to Him about what areas and places He wants to enter and heal. The retreat is based on the resources of the John Paul II Healing Center and the books of Dr. Bob Schuchts, [Be Healed](#) and [Be Transformed](#). A priest for 23 years, Fr. Craig Doty is pastor of St. Mary Church in Denton and director of the Lincoln Equipping Team, whose prayer teams will be available on this retreat. The men and women in this prayer and healing ministry are unafraid to pray with anyone, anywhere, for any intention - including yours. Our Lady of Good Counsel Retreat House near Waverly features weekend retreats that begin Friday at 8pm with a rosary and Mass, and conclude Sunday with Mass and noon lunch. Two Plenary Indulgences one can gain for a deceased family member or friend or the Poor Souls: A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted each and every day from Nov 1 to Nov 8, who devoutly visit a cemetery and there pray, if only mentally, for the departed. A plenary indulgence is granted the faithful who, on All Souls' Day devoutly visits a church or an oratory and recites an Our Father and the Creed. Requirements for obtaining a plenary indulgence: Do the work while in a state of grace, Receive Sacramental confession within 20 days of the work (several plenary indulgences may be earned per reception), Receive Eucharistic communion (one plenary indulgence may be earned per reception), Pray for the pope's intentions (Our Father and Hail Mary, or other appropriate prayer, is sufficient), Have no attachment to sin (even venial) – i.e., it is sufficient that the Christian makes an act of the will to love God and despise sin. If the Requirements are not fully fulfilled the work becomes a partial indulgence.

Mary's Promises for Daily Devotion

The most amazing thing about the Rosary is that Mary made **15 promises** to those who recite it daily. These aren't insignificant promises, but rather enormously helpful graces provided to those who are trying to live a good and faithful Catholic life:

1. To all those who shall pray my Rosary devoutly, I promise my special protection and great graces.
2. Those who shall persevere in the recitation of my Rosary will receive signal graces.
3. The Rosary will be a very powerful armor against Hell; it will destroy vice, deliver from sin, and dispel heresy.
4. The Rosary will make virtue and good works flourish, and will obtain for souls the most abundant divine mercies. It will draw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
5. Those who trust themselves to me through the Rosary will not perish.
6. Whoever recites my Rosary devoutly, reflecting on the mysteries, shall never be overwhelmed by misfortune. He will not experience the anger of God nor will he perish by an unprovided death. The sinner will be converted; the just will persevere in grace and merit eternal life.
7. Those truly devoted to my Rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
8. Those who are faithful to recite my Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the light of God and the plenitude of His graces and will share in the merits of the blessed.
9. I will deliver promptly from Purgatory souls devoted to my Rosary.
10. True children of my Rosary will enjoy great glory in Heaven.
11. What you shall ask through my Rosary you shall obtain.
12. To those who propagate my Rosary I promise aid in all their necessities.
13. I have obtained from my Son that all the members of the Rosary Confraternity shall have as their intercessors, in life and in death, the entire celestial court.
14. Those who recite my Rosary faithfully are my beloved children, the brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ.
15. Devotion to my Rosary is a special sign of predestination.

Don't forget to pray for those who have died and meeting God's justice in the mercy of Purgatory.
